

Alcester Police SNTs. Latest Weekly Report. Sunday 5th February 2023

Based at Alcester Police Station, The Safer Neighbourhood team's primary roles are around crime prevention, problem solving both long standing or emerging issues of community concern and community engagement. We are supported at Alcester by colleagues from Patrol teams whose role is to respond to incidents and investigate crimes that occur in the area 24/7. The SNT is supervised by Inspector Hembry who leads on Neighbourhood Policing for Stratford District and Sgt Ebbs who also oversees neighbourhood Policing in the Shipston on Stour area. Alcester SNT currently consists of 2 Police officers and 4 Police Community Support Officers, and our contact details are shown above.

HELP STOP VEHICLE CRIME

Help prevent thieves taking your belongings. Remove all valuables and tools from cars and vans. Ensure your vehicle is locked. Have a tracker fitted to your vehicle. Try and park your vehicle where it is covered by CCTV. Use a Faraday pouch to store your key.

We have also seen a recent increase of theft of registration plates across the Stratford District. Your local SNTs are targeting this behaviour with one method being to hand out some crime prevention resources. Anti-tamper screws are an effective way to stop this type of theft. Some local community hubs such as village halls and leisure centres, in villages/towns where this crime has been prevalent have been handed these in order to pass out to members of the public. So, if you see any please grab a pack and use them on your car.


